He'll be here to tell us how to serve our draft homebrew better. Todd Donnelly will also have some slides to show off his kegerator. It's an amazingly customized chest freezer that everyone will enjoy seeing how he made it.

Last month, Wizard of SAAZ was held in Akron. SAAZ beat our club handily in the Cuyahoga Cup scoring. Congratulations to Mike Malinowski and the rest of the SAAZ medal winners. The reason I bring it up is that it's already time to start looking ahead to Son of Brewzilla so that we can win The Cup back on our home turf. Dave Clark has too much to do to be the competition organizer, so I am looking for someone to step up to lead our Competition Committee this year. This is an opportunity to get some BJCP points and help out SNOB. I'm already organizing the IX Center's International Beer Fest competition, so I'd rather focus on the other club events we do in The Fall.

Enough congratulating homebrewers from another club. As I started writing this, Greg Irving emailed me. His American Amber Ale won Best of Show at The Chicago Winter Brew Competition. Greg's beer will be brewed at Broad Shoulders Brewing

Company as their winter seasonal. So, join with me in congratulating Greg in winning an out-of-town 450-entry homebrew competition. If you're on your way to Chicago soon, you may want to look out for Broad Shoulders Brewing Company and the Winter Seasonal Amber Ale. Greg's Amber Ale didn't place at Wizard of SAAZ a week earlier. The judges in Akron felt his beer would have been better scored as a Pale Ale. That happens. I think the best you can do is have a thicker skin when you're competing and trust your own preferences. If you like how your beer came out, get a second opinion on another competition or at a club meeting if you don't agree with the judging results. This isn't a jab at judges or the Wizard of SAAZ organizers. BJCP beer styles have room for interpretation. Judges may have an off day. Your beer may not be at its peak. Shrug off your disappointing scores and try again.

This month, our SNOB Night Out will be Wednesday, February 15th at The Brew Kettle. It will be in the middle of Ogre Fest. This was a great Night Out last year, so why not go again this year. Come hang out with your fellow SNOBs as we sample high gravity beers and enjoy great food in Strongsville. East Side hop heads are starting to look forward to February as Ballentine and 1899 hold their third annual IPAlooza all month. You also won't want to miss Winter Warmer Fest on Saturday, February 25th. The Ohio Craft Brewers Association's Winter Beer Fest at Windows on the River has been traditionally one of the better beer fests in the area.

I have another homebrewing tip to pass along to all of you. I brewed a Pale Ale in December and I pushed it quickly so that it would be fresh and hoppy for Wizard of SAAZ. I didn't use a secondary and added my dry hops about 5 days into primary fermentation. At 10 days, I kegged the beer. I tasted a sample as I transferred to the keg. I thought I recognized some diacetyl in a sample I drew and worried. Unfortunately, that diacetyl was prominent once the beer was fully carbonated. Jack Kephart, amongst a few other friends tried some at a party during the holidays. He told me to pitch some fresh yeast into the keg and keep it warm. So, I purchased a Wyeast smack pack of yeast on New Years Eve and pitched it into my keg before going to a party. The next week, I put the beer back in my cooler and re-carbonated. The diacetyl was gone. I had some more haze, but my beer tasted clean. The beer didn't medal, but I enjoyed the results. The next time one of your beers comes out buttery, give it some time with some fresh yeast

and maybe your results will be like mine. Remember to bring in your stouts to our meeting in March. We'll be holding a clubonly competition following the BJCP Stout Category guidelines. The winner's beer will be sent to the National round for the Stout Club-Only Competition in March. Bring three 12 ounce bottles of beer to the meeting and we'll have a team of our judges find the best to send to Colorado.
