President's Message

Our upcoming club monthly meeting topics have been planned. We will be discussing and sharing chocolate and beer pairings for February. I am going to have a couple of local craft beer business owners join me for a panel discussion of our local craft beer industry in March. For the April meeting, we will be discussing IPAs and how to brew IPAs. Other upcoming topics should be around fermenting hot sauce and fermenting in corny kegs. I'd also like to have a topic on homebrew canning. If you would like to volunteer for a meeting topic or you have requests, please let me know.



One of the things that I think some of you may have seen recently has given me some optimism for Homebrewing. The American Homebrewers Association (AHA) has started making steps to become independent from the Brewers Association (BA). Since the early days of the pandemic when multiple people that worked for the AHA and BA were let go to lower costs, I believe that the AHA has become less of a partner organization and more of a subsidiary to the BA. We've lost the Homebrewers Conference that I enjoyed going to annually. The National Homebrew Competition changes lessened my desire to enter and volunteer my time as a judge or local organizer. I was starting to expect that the AHA would eventually be shuddered by the BA. This move gives me some hope that in the future, the AHA can return to the national organization that I was happy to be a member of.

For this month, we'd like to make the meeting into something more collaborative. Everyone is encouraged to bring in a chocolate and beer pairing they can share. I don't want to make the rules too restrictive. Plan to bring in at least 20 oz of beer and a chocolate item you can share to about 20 people. I hope that we get as many as 12 of us to participate. I plan to bring a keg of my English Porter that I made last fall and cocoa roasted almonds. We would like to know which pairings you have discovered. More than just hearing about them, let's bring in examples. Hopefully, this will be a lively conversation where we will all get to try multiple beer and chocolate pairings. Also, later this month, we will have the return of our chili cook-off at Forest City Brewery. It's been a great annual Night Out and I'm looking forward to another great evening of chili and beer at Forest City.

Local Upcoming Festivals


There are several area beer fests coming up. They are each a good opportunity to get out and mingle with fellow SNOBs and beer lovers.


