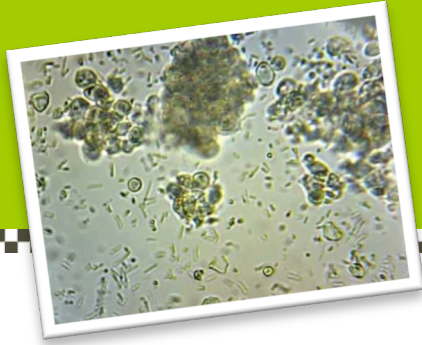

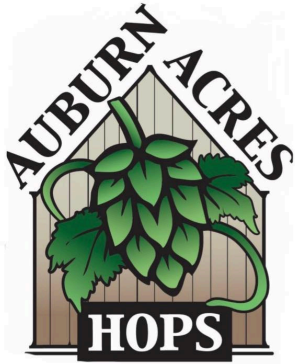
Thank you to Ralph and Drew for making some great wort!
