#### President's Krausening - Mike Ontolchik

#### Hi SNOBs,

May was kind busy with the Big Brew wort share, our meeting and two SNOBs Night Out opportunities. June won't be much different with our June and July meetings and a SNOBs Night Out sandwiched between them.



I assembled a panel of SNOBs that have electric brewing systems for our June meeting. I am going to ask them questions about their individual equipment and

their processes for brew day. Hopefully, we can turn this into a lively group discussion. I'm a little interested in maybe getting a 5 gallon electric brew system for myself to use in the cold winter months or for one off batches over my propane powered 10 gallon brew stand. I have had a sous vide recirculating electric water heater for a few years so I expect that some of these systems may use similar tech to hold the mash water or kettle boil at a constant temperature. We did have a local brewery that has been closed for years that had an electric setup. Their electric heaters seemed to be underpowered for their volume. When I asked the brewer about their wide and shallow brew kettle, he told me that the boil would only roll softly so he didn't lose as much in evaporation as I expected. A boil that light would have difficulty blowing off DMS precursors.

For Big Brew, we had 25 entrants and we should expect most of those to be at our July meeting on Friday, June 28th. We'll work out the details with Sachsenheim but expect for them to have a summer cookout style menu that we can all order from as we sample these Big Brew beers made from the wort donated to us from Terrestrial Brewing. Ralph had to squeeze out every drop of wort that he produced for all of our buckets. I was expecting that we would have more volume or less requests. Every entrant I think left with about 5 gallons of wort. It should be another great evening and I do like the format we have turned this into instead of attempting to do it on a Monday. Having less wort than expected, I shifted my recipe from a Double IPA to an American IPA using some of the hop sampler bags that Fat Heads gave us in April. The beer has lime and orange like citrus notes from the Bravo and Tango hops I used along with some Mosaic that I bought at The Cleveland Brew Shop. The beer is keg conditioning and will be ready for the end of the month.

## **June Meeting**

Electric brewing offers homebrewers a convenient and efficient way to brew beer. With precise temperature control, safety features, and the ability to try different techniques, electric brewing systems are becoming very popular.

Electric brewing systems are very efficient. There is almost no heat lost during the brewing process meaning that less energy is wasted than a gaspowered brewing systems, where heat can escape through the burner or kettle. With electric systems you don't have the risk of propane leaks or carbon monoxide poisoning. You can brew indoors without worrying about drafts or fire risks.





There are a wide variety of electric systems available from small one piece systems like the Grainfather to full three-kettle all grain recirculating mash systems.

Mike has assembled a panel of SNOBs that have electric brewing systems to discuss the pros and cons of these systems. Come with your questions and comments.




