March is set to be one of the most action-packed months of the year for SNOBs. We begin with our meeting on 3/7 which will provide a solid malt backbone for the rest of the month. Andrew from Haus Malts will be giving a technical presentation on the art of malting, and will have his own malts available for purchase by the pound. I had the pleasure of touring the Haus Malt facility this past October and am looking forward to brewing with his Pale, Vienna, and Spelt malts this year. A few weeks ago while on a brew-cation in Asheville, NC I toured another micro-maltster, Riverbend Malt House. Riverbend sources locally grown (NC) barley, wheat, and rye and uses the old-fashioned floor-malting method to create some truly unique products. Along with the Haus Malt grains, SNOB members will have the opportunity to purchase some Riverbend grains at our upcoming meeting as well.

The weekend following our meeting is our annual "Beer no Sweat" bus trip, which departs on Saturday 3/12 and returns on Sunday 3/13. This year we are traveling to Buffalo, NY by way of Erie, PA and Jamestown, NY. Most of our stops are at smaller breweries that do not distribute to the Cleveland market, and I am very excited to taste these local flavors for the first time.

For those of us who like to brew competitively, March is one of the busiest months for homebrew competitions. Nationally, the 1st round of the NHC begins in March, with regional judging occurring in Indianapolis, Philadelphia, Nashville, Chicago, and beyond. Regionally, the Wizard of SAAZ (Akron) competition will be held 3/15 - 3/19, the Freemont Homebrew Throwdown will be held on 3/25, and in the beginning of April the Amber Waves of Grain competition (Buffalo) will be held on 4/1-4/2, and the Trash Homebrew Competition (Pittsburgh) will be held on 4/9.

March also has one of my personal favorite beer festivals, the 10th annual Winter Warmer Fest at Windows on the River down in The Flats. The Winter Warmer Fest is the signature event put on by the Ohio Craft Brewers Association. All of your favorite local breweries will be



there, as well as others from Columbus, Cincinnati, Athens, and beyond. If you are a fan of Ohio-brewed beer, this is an event you will not want to miss.

I'll have to say though, that participation is much lower than I thought it would be.

The malts will be whole and you will need to mill with a friend or take with you to your LHBS when you purchase the rest of your grain bill. We will not mill at the meeting. We will have bags, scoops and scales but feel free to bring your airtight container to put your malt into.



- Riverbend Floor-Malted 6-Row* Pilsner at \$1/lb, **we only have 50#, 44# still available**
- Riverbend Floor-Malted Carolina Wheat at \$1.50/lb, **we have 50#, 30# still available**
- Haus Malts Pale base malt at \$1/lb
- Haus Malts Vienna malt at \$1/lb
- Haus Malts Spelt malt at \$1.50/lb

*Note that the Riverbend Pilsner is 6-Row. 6-Row kernel's are smaller than 2-Row which may require narrowing the gap in your mill to crush.

National Homebrewers Conference

The 2016 NHC is once again in our neck of the woods, kind of, Baltimore to be exact, June 9th thru the 11th. Open to all AHA members, application to enter is from 2/1 thru 2/7, first round entries are due 2/29 thru 3/9 and cost \$14 each. Cost to attend NHC is \$220 and \$160 for the full and social packages respectively plus add-on for the Grand Banquet and Awards Ceremony.



If you've never been, you should save up your \$ and attend. Mike O has registered the SNOB for club night and we will be bringing the 12-tap SNOB bar and serving so we hope you will consider **contributing a keg**, even if it is only 2 gallons, of your finest fermented beverage. In the past, we've taken around 24 kegs.

When in this part of the country, we've had a pretty nice size group of SNOB attend and able to help with the SNOB activities, everything from transporting bar and kegs, setup, working the bar, teardown and the like. We also "try hard" to hit every brewery possible on the way there and back.

Registration

- Registration opens at **Noon ET**, March 8, 2016.
- The 2016 registration will take place in real-time on March 8.
- There is no application window. Registrations are offered first-come, first-served.
- The AHA anticipates enough space in Baltimore to accommodate all members who wish to attend.
- Payment is required to complete the registration process.

Membership

- Conference registration is open only to American Homebrewers Association or Brewers Association (AHA/BA) members 21 years or older.
- [Membership](#) must be current at the time of registration and the event to attend the conference.

Guests

- Any AHA/BA member may register other AHA/BA members.
- All attendees *must* be members of the AHA/BA.
- Any member can choose between any registration option. (Ex. the Social Package registration is available to any AHA/BA member and does not have to be combined with the purchase of a Full Conference registration.)
- Banquet tickets must be purchased with a Full Conference, Social Package or Homebrew Industry registration. They cannot be purchased alone.

Larry Reuter will be driving NHC entries to these three judging centers. If you have entries going to any of these and would like to send along with Larry, you must get your boxed up entries to Larry by March 1. Contact Larry via email to make arrangements.
