President's Krausening

I've never met a homebrewer who brewed simply to save money on beer. Homebrewing is time-consuming and when factoring in the cost of ingredients and equipment it is a break-even proposition at best. No, most of us brew for a variety of other more fun personal reasons. We enjoy the challenge, the learning, sharing the fruits of our labors with friends, competing for awards, being a part of the beer community, etc.

One thing that is also universal among the homebrewers I know is that we all seek to improve our craft. We're always trying to improve on the last batch. If we have a recipe for a style we like, we want to brew it again and tweak it a little to make each iteration just a little bit better. In order to do that we rely upon our own sense of what we like as well as the feedback we get from friends and those we share with.

I've found that the best way to get feedback on my brews is from certified beer judges in a sanctioned homebrew competition. So I am especially pleased that Son of Brewzilla will be returning this fall. I've found that there is no better way to improve my craft than to submit entries to a competition and to receive unbiased feedback on the aroma, appearance, flavor, mouthfeel, and overall impression. Often the more experienced judges will include helpful comments on how the beer might be improved. The icing on the cake is that when we are successful, we are recognized by our peers for our successes.

It takes a lot of work on the part of organizers, volunteers and brewers to put on one of these events so I want to urge club members to participate by getting your entries reserved and brewed and to volunteer to help make it run smoothly. I'd also like to thank the organizing committee for getting this off the ground this year. Thanks to Todd Donnelly, Registrar; Greg Irving, Competition Organizer; Jim Jadwisiak, Sponsorship Organizer; and Mike Ontolchik, Judge Coordinator for their hard work.
