

Extra, Extra Ohio craft-brewing's impact tops \$1 Billion


Ohio craft breweries are responsible for \$1.27 billion in economic impact, according to a biennial report released by the Ohio Craft Breweries Association.

The report from Silverlode Consulting shows the state's craft-brewing industry resumed growth in 2022 after what the OCBA calls "an 8.9% pandemic-induced downturn in 2020."

The numbers bear out the industry's importance regardless of whether someone loves craft beer, is a non-drinker or consumes other products

Among the figures cited in the report, which covers 2022:

- Ohio has 420 craft breweries.
- 44 breweries opened.
- Ohio's craft-beer production volume ranks sixth among all states.
- Breweries are responsible for \$1.27 billion in economic output
 up from \$880.7 million in 2020.
- From a tax standpoint, breweries are responsible for \$141.5 million (state and local) and \$85.8 million (federal).



In addition to the 420 breweries, 64 are in planning stages. Across the state, the craft-brewing industry is responsible for a total of 12,040 Ohio jobs – 9,246 direct and 2,794 indirect.

Of the 420, almost 34% - 142 breweries - are in Northeast Ohio.

The Greater Cleveland region – which encompasses Ashtabula, Cuyahoga, Geauga, Lake and Lorain counties – has 60 craft breweries with 14 in planning and 1,825 direct jobs accounted for.

The Northeast region has 82 craft breweries. The area includes Ashland, Carroll, Columbiana, Holmes, Knox, Mahoning, Medina, Portage, Richland, Stark, Summit, Trumbull, Tuscarawas and Wayne counties. Ten breweries are in planning, and 1,382 direct jobs are accounted for.

The report paints a picture of consistent, steady growth, reflecting consumer spending in taprooms. But the industry has its share of challenges. They include changing demographics, increased competition and what the organization says is a draconian law governing distribution contracts that limit breweries.

The 15-year-old non-profit OCBA lobbies on behalf of the state's breweries via legislation and marketing campaigns.


